He is preceded in death by his wife and soul mate Nina and survived by his loving daughters Noelle, Shannon, Kassi, and Tori, devoted son Kenny, and most precious grandchildren Mya and George. He was a little hockey all-star that once scored six goals in a single game, forcing our mother to cheer for the other team. He was a dedicated employee of Continental, now United Airlines starting in 1984 and finishing as an Airframe and Powerplant Mechanic on 2/8/21. He had no filter so when provoked, delivered the uncensored version of what everyone else was thinking, while not holding a grudge.
